Route 9A Update/Senate Bill

S8795. The Mayor reports that as a result of your continued support combined with our public stand focused on the out of date and dangerous conditions of Route 9A, this NYS Senate Bill has been assigned a "Same As" bill in the NYS Assembly Bill A11126. We are encouraging residents to go to nysenate.gov/legislation/bills/2019/A11126 and click on the box to support this bill that would authorize the Department of Transportation to conduct a study pertaining to proposed improvements of State Route 9A in the Towns of Ossining and Mount Pleasant.



A LOOK AHEAD: WHAT TO EXPECT IN THE VILLAGE IN 2021!

Central Business District

We have several plans scheduled for our downtown. These are some highlights:

Cross Access Parking

A project (many, many) years in the making is moving forward. The project includes providing cross access circulation and parking behind the Central Business District and is being designed in conjunction with our Streetscape Project.



Streetscape

After much public input, this Capital Project has been designed to revamp the entire appearance of the Village's Central Business District. Project is expected to be out to bid in early 2021 with the hopes of a spring start. Improvements include new streetlights, trees, raised crosswalks and most importantly new sidewalks.

The image to the left is the proposed design for this project.

Village Hall ADA Project

Starting this spring, the exterior of the Village's Municipal Building will be receiving a facelift with help from a DASNY Grant.

All operations in Village Hall will be accessible during this project. Some New Features Include new sitting wall with charging stations, repaving of firehouse driveway, revamped landscaping

plan, increased lighting, highlighting the monument bell and more.



Tuttle Road Rehabilitation

New drainage, pavement, sidewalks and curbs will be installed on Tuttle Road as part of the overall Law Park Drainage Basin Project. One of the goals of this project is to make the roadway more pedestrian friendly. This Capital Project is currently out to bid and is set to be awarded in February. Please stay tuned to additional information regarding detour plan.



POLICE REFORM AND REINVENTION COLLABORATIVE

Governor Cuomo's Executive Order 203 from June 2020 required all local governments to perform a comprehensive review of their police departments to ensure "deployments, strategies, policies, procedures and practices" are best serving the needs of the communities and fostering "trust, fairness, and legitimacy." As a result, the Board of Trustees formed the Police Reform Advisory Committee, comprised of 13 community members, who will meet the 1st and 3rd Monday of each month to make suggestions for further consideration. All meetings are open to the public, and residents are invited to participate at a public forum via Zoom on Saturday, January 23rd.

The BMFD members look just like you. They have families and jobs. They might coach youth sports, or run local businesses, commute to their offices, raise their children here. They took a chance, endured the hours of training, experienced the thrill of jumping on a rig to save a neighbor's house. They now know the camaraderie of working as a team to keep their community safe, while making new local friends, and sharing the pride that comes from having the courage and dedication.

- work-from-home professional to give us a couple of calls a week.
- HS and gap-year students to learn the career skills of a real "first responder."

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR RESIDENTS

Overnight Winter Parking Restrictions:
Starting December 1, and through March 31, the annual overnight parking ban is in effect. The ban prohibits parking from 2:00 AM to 6:00 AM on any Village street, road or Municipal Parking lot with the exception of the Scarborough Train Station Parking Lot. Overnight parking at VBM's Railroad Station lot is prohibited from 3:00 AM to 6:00 AM. Violators will be fined.

Tax Payment: The second installment of Village property taxes are due on or before Thursday December 31, 2020. Village Hall will be open until 4:30pm on December 31st to accept payments in person. A clear and legible postmarked date of December 31, 2020 is acceptable for payments that are mailed to Village Hall. Payments can also be made online without penalty until 11:59pm or dropped in the drop box in front of Village Hall on December 31st.

2021 Scarborough Station Parking Permits: Special discounted parking rates for 2021! Applications are currently being accepted by mail, in person or by utilizing the drop box in front of Village Hall.
