CURBSIDE RECYCLING GUIDELINES AND CHANGES

As of June 1, 2011, plastics 3 through 7 have been added to Westchester County's list of mandated recyclables. Recyclable plastics now include food, beverage, detergent and shampoo containers and caps, which should be rinsed clean before going into the recycling bin. With the expansion of the County's Source Separation Law, all residents, businesses, schools and institutions are required to separate for recycling all empty plastic containers marked with triangular chasing arrows symbol and coded with a number 1 through 7, with the exception of items listed below.

Don't include the following plastic items:

- Plastic bags, all plastic film (e.g. dry cleaning bags and packaging materials), vinyl
- Unmarked or non-coded plastics (e.g. toys, clothing hangers, tableware and utensils)
- Large rigid plastics (e.g. toys and furniture)
- Plastic Foam (e.g. hot beverage cups, trays and packaging materials)
- Containers that may have held hazardous materials (e.g. motor oil, solvents and pesticides)
- Building materials (e.g. pvc piping and bathroom and kitchen fixtures)

Paper and Cardboard including newspapers, glossy inserts, phone books, magazines, junk mail, brown paper bags, toilet paper and paper towel tubes and corrugated and grey cardboard boxes should be placed in a brown paper bag or loose in the recycling bin but not comingled with glass, plastics and metals. They can also be flattened and placed inside each other. Please don't recycle waxed cardboard, cardboard with any trace of food or paper or hardcover books.

Please be sure to put recyclables and garbage in the proper receptacles. Please call the Department of Public Works with any questions.

VILLAGE REAL PROPERTY TAXES

Village Real Property Tax Bills for 2011 were mailed at the end of May 2011. The First Installment is due by July 1, 2011. A penalty of 5% will be applied on all unpaid balances as of July 2, 2011. Additional penalties will accrue each month the taxes remained unpaid.

***The Second Installment is due by January 3, 2012. The payment coupon for the Second Installment is attached to the bills that are being mailed in May – **no additional bills will be mailed.**
