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From Your Board of Trustees

As a new year begins, your Board of Trustees is excited about the many opportunities we continue to embrace for the future of our Village. This year, as with the past few years, the Board is committed to making smart, effective investments that will benefit residents, businesses, and visitors to Briarcliff Manor.

A vast amount of the current Board's focus is on long-range improvements to our wonderful Village.

Working closely with Village Manager Josh Ringel, the Board recently completed a major revitalization of Village staff. In the last few years, we tackled the generational challenge of replacing every department head, mostly due to retirements. Our Village team remains stellar, and we are excited to see all the great work that will be done by these employees.

The Board continues to revise and improve outdated local laws, many of which were untouched for decades, improving and crafting them for the realities of our Village

today. In the coming year, we will review and update our Comprehensive Plan, a municipality's master blueprint for future development, identifying goals, strategies, action items for land use, housing, transportation, economic development, and environmental preservation.

After successful efforts to secure funding of multiple grants, we updated four public parks, reimaged the Youth Center, and installed a new connection from the NYS Empire Trail to our downtown area. Much of this work was performed in-house by our talented DPW employees, allowing these funds to stretch further.

Newly implemented software has placed far more information online, automated registration for all Village recreation programs, and will enable a move to online payment of all Village permits in the coming months. A joint effort by our Recreation Department, the Recreation Advisory Committee, and the Village Board will kick off a project this year to redesign the Village pool.

We continue to focus on smarter environmental choices for our Village, fostering sustainability, lowering the ongoing costs of maintenance, and improving indoor and outdoor assets. This coming year will bring the installation of electric vehicle chargers to designated parking lots, a food scraps recycling program, highly efficient HVAC to our library, and a shift toward pollinator pathways in several landscaped gardens. Several of these projects have been spearheaded by our volunteer groups, including the Environmental Advisory Council and the Sustainability Advisory Committee, who continue to educate the community on best practices.

This past year the Board formed the Briarcliff Manor Local Development Corporation, which will help shepherd the future development of key Village-owned parcels and provide an opportunity for added financial benefits to the Village.

Finally, culminating years of planning, the Village will break ground on major initiatives to reenergize our main business corridor. A developer will be selected for the property at 1050 Pleasantville Road, the former site of the Wells Fargo bank, a development that will create new housing, additional retail stores, parking, and expanded place-making. We expect our investment in the land will return five-fold on assets alone, with the developer constructing a new municipal building for our Briarcliff Police and Village Court. And with the final approval of millions of NYS grant money as we work through the completion of the grant process, we will break ground on the Streetscapes and Mobility project, redesigning our downtown as a more pedestrian-friendly gathering spot.

With so much more to come this year, we wish all a happy, healthy new year!

A NOTE FROM CHIEF BUETI

The BMPD has introduced a new drone, fully funded by the NYS LE Tech Grant, to enhance policing efforts. Drones offer valuable support for law enforcement operations, including:

- **Enhanced Surveillance:** Equipped with HD cameras and thermal imaging, drones provide real-time aerial views for monitoring large events or tracking suspects, offering a cost-effective alternative to helicopters.
- **Search and Rescue:** Drones quickly cover large areas, helping locate missing persons in hard-to-reach or dangerous locations.
- **Crime Scene Documentation:** They capture detailed aerial footage for evidence collection, particularly in large or inaccessible crime scenes.
- **Pursuit and Tracking:** Drones maintain visual contact with fleeing suspects, especially in high-speed chases or challenging terrains.
- **Traffic Monitoring:** They efficiently document traffic violations, manage congestion, and assist in accident reconstruction.

Additionally, the BMPD launched a bicycle unit this year to improve mobility, community engagement, and cost efficiency. Key benefits include:

- **Increased Mobility:** Bikes navigate areas inaccessible to patrol cars, such as parks, pedestrian paths, and crowded streets. During events like Halloween on the Tree Streets, the unit effectively patrolled amid closures and heavy crowds.
- **Community Engagement:** Officers on bicycles are approachable and visible, fostering trust and deterring crime in high-traffic areas. This summer, the unit addressed pedestrian and parking issues in the CBD.
- **Environmental and Cost Benefits:** Bicycles are eco-friendly, affordable to maintain, and reduce traffic congestion.
- **Physical Fitness:** Cycling promotes officer health, fitness, and resilience during shifts.

These initiatives enhance BMPD's operational capabilities and strengthen ties with the community.

Congrats to PO Antonio DaCruz for receiving AAAs 2024 Hero Award at the 60th Annual Community Traffic Safety Awards. The Village of Briarcliff Manor also received their Gold Award for traffic safety. The Gold Award was an upgrade from the Silver Award the village won in 2023. PO DaCruz is a part of our newly formed Bicycle Unit and our most productive officer with vehicle and traffic violations. We look forward to our continued efforts with the Traffic Safety Committee to make the roadways in Briarcliff Manor even safer.



Briarcliff Manor to Lower Village-Wide Speed Limit to 25 MPH

Starting May 27, 2024, the Village of Briarcliff Manor will reduce its Village-wide speed limit from 30 MPH to 25 MPH. This change, adopted by the Board of Trustees on **November 12, 2024**, and based on a Traffic Engineering Study by DTS Provident, aims to enhance pedestrian and vehicular safety.

Key Points:

- **Scope:** The new 25 MPH limit applies to all local streets under Village jurisdiction.
- **Exceptions:** State, county, and major arterial roads, as well as certain Village collector roads, will retain their existing speed limits of 30 MPH. Specific roads include Scarborough Station Road, Sleepy Hollow Road, South State Road, and Route 9A, among others. Existing school zone limits will also remain unchanged.
- **Implementation:** Includes new signage installation and a public awareness campaign.

Lowering the speed limit improves reaction times and reduces collision severity, underscoring the Village's commitment to safety while adhering to jurisdictional and road classification restrictions.



Everbridge Notification System: This is the Village's emergency / urgent notification system. We typically email or text, with voice calls reserved for emergency situations or updates only.

How It Works: When we issue a notification about a potential safety hazard, water main break, road closure, etc., you will receive a message via text and email communication methods that you have registered.

A LOOK AHEAD: WHAT TO EXPECT IN THE VILLAGE IN 2025

Capital Project Outlook: 2025

The Village of Briarcliff Manor is excited to enhance community infrastructure and environment through several capital projects in 2025. Here's what to expect:

- **Jackson Park Basketball Court Rehabilitation:** Following the playground replacement in December 2024, the basketball court will be upgraded with partial funding from a \$100,000 grant by Senator Andrea Stewart-Cousins. Completion is expected in **Spring 2025**.
- **Pollinator Gardens:** In collaboration with the Environmental Advisory Council, pollinator gardens will be planted at the Library/Community Center Circle and Pocket Park to boost biodiversity. Planting begins in **Spring 2025**.
- **Pleasantville Road Streetscape:** The Central Business District will undergo transformation as part of the Mobility Project, largely funded by a \$3M Transportation Alternatives Program Grant. Construction starts **Spring 2025**.
- **Library HVAC Upgrades:** The aging HVAC system will be replaced with grant funding from Senator Harckham (\$100,000), pending approval from Assemblywoman Levenberg (\$100,000), and Library Construction Aid (total aid TBD). More than 50% of this project will be paid by grant funding. Work begins **Fall 2025**.
- **Water Meter Head Replacement & Lead Line Verification:** The Village will continue replacing water meter heads for efficient readings and verifying lead-free water service lines throughout 2025.
- **Law Park Drainage Basin Phase II:** Improvements include reconstructing Pine Road (Birch to Elm) with new drainage and creating an outlet from Law Park Pond to the Pocantico River. Supported by a \$1.2M Westchester County grant, construction begins **Spring/Summer 2025**.
- **River Road Widening:** To improve safety at River Road and Route 9, the Village will widen the intersection, pending state approval. Construction begins **Spring/Summer 2025**.
- **Pool Complex Renewal:** Design work for replacing the 50+ year-old pool will advance in 2025, with updates throughout the year. Construction is not planned for 2025.
- **Tri-Village Chlorination** With the NYCDEP ending its water chlorination, the Village is upgrading its water distribution system to meet health department standards. Collaborating with Tarrytown and Sleepy Hollow (the "Tri-Village"), Briarcliff Manor is funding upgrades at the shared "tap-building" to ensure compliance and high-quality drinking water. The project is set for completion by the end of **2024**.
- **Water Main Projects** Planned water main replacements include Route 9, Chappaqua Road, and cleaning/lining the Village Main under Sleepy Hollow Country Club. These upgrades aim to reduce leaks, improve system resiliency, and maintain stable water pressure and fire protection.
- **Additional Projects:** Ongoing water, sewer, and departmental projects are under consideration.

Recently Completed Projects

- **Law Park Playground & Neighborhood Park** New playground equipment with integrated shade was installed at Law Park, while a relocated structure, less than 10 years old, was moved to Neighborhood Park.
- **Law Park Parking Lot Reconfiguration** Completed in **Fall 2024**, this project improved traffic flow and safety and added pedestrian access from the park to the rear parking lot.
- **Club Field Walking Track** Phase 1 of a ¼-mile walking track with French drains to improve drainage was completed in 2024. Phase 2 begins in **late Spring 2025** and includes entrance upgrades, new plantings, and removal of some hardscape.

VOLUNTEERS AT WORK:

CELEBRATING COMMUNITY AND 2024 MILESTONES

As 2024 comes to a close, we're reflecting on the incredible volunteer-driven efforts that have made Briarcliff Manor a thriving, connected community. From sustainability initiatives to recreation programs and emergency services, our volunteers have made a lasting impact this year. Below are the key achievements and opportunities to get involved:

Sustainability & Environmental Initiatives

- **Zero Waste Campaigns:** Successful events like *Stash the Trash* (Earth Day), *Take It or Leave It Swap* (4,000 lbs of items), and sports equipment and holiday swaps helped reduce waste and engage residents.
- **Pollinator Garden:** In spring 2025, the Environmental Advisory Council (EAC) will restore a garden at the Briarcliff Manor Library with native plants, signage, and a rain barrel.
- **Clean Energy Campaigns:** SAC helped 40 residents go electric with EV purchases and promoted community solar signups. Over \$60,000 in state grants were secured for energy audits, electric vehicles, and municipal upgrades.

Educational Outreach: SAC organized the screening of *The Clean Bin Project* and ran a poster contest on plastic pollution. Information on clean energy and composting was shared at events like Community Day. Visit the SAC page on the Village website to check out our quarterly newsletters and for information and event announcements!

Recreation Advisory Committee (RAC) Updates

- **Friends of Briarcliff Manor Parks:** The RAC raised over \$2,500 through the establishment of a nonprofit fund to support park projects.
- **Law Park Playground:** Advocated for a new shade structure and relocated the 2-5 play structure to Neighborhood Park.
- **AED Installations:** Partnered to place AEDs in parks for improved safety.
- **Community Day:** Introduced inclusive features like the Teal Pumpkin Project and a Toddler Tent, while raising funds for the Friends of Briarcliff Manor Parks.
- **Future Projects:** Supported the plans for Jackson Park Playground, Briarcliff Pool reconstruction, and the sports wall at Club Field.

Looking Ahead to 2025: The RAC is improving camp registration and planning an exciting year of events for all ages.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR RESIDENTS

Overnight Winter Parking Restrictions:

Starting **December 1**, and through **March 31**, the annual overnight parking ban is in effect. The ban prohibits parking from 2:00 AM to 6:00 AM on any Village street, road or Municipal Parking lot with the exception of the Scarborough Train Station Parking Lot. Overnight parking at VBM's Railroad Station lot is prohibited from 3:00 AM to 6:00 AM. Violators will be fined.

Ensure your contractors are licensed in Westchester County and insured. Licensed contractors will handle permit filings, complete work to code, and secure a Certificate of Occupancy. Proper permits ensure compliance with NYS Fire Prevention, Building Codes, and local regulations, protecting your home and family.
